
Oregon'izing a Highball Signal By Mike Fisher


When I saw this great project in the October 2017 issue of Garden Railways I knew that a few of those would be a great fit for my Nebraska Oregon Railroad.




In reading Todd Haskins article I realized that the base he used would not be adequate for out in my garden. I needed something much more substantial. So after some thought I decided to Oregon-ize it, or as my wife calls it, Fisherizing it.



I thought about a few options and decided on a poured cement base. This base provides some great benefits. It is totally weather proof and will never rot. It is substantial enough to just sit above ground but can easily be placed so that it's flush with the ground. As it is heavy it can withstand any weather along with the squirrel 'o' saurus that roam the wilds in the railroad. For the base I attached 2 small pieces of wood to the main upright. I then



used 2 common nails glued to the base as rebar. I next used some scrap wood and made a simple square form. For the cement I used some leftover anchoring cement from a previous project. Once poured I let it sit over night and removed the forms.



As the cement was still somewhat soft I scuffed the cement for a better appearance.


Further Rules and Regulations to be determined in the fullness of time.



Holmes to travel to <u>Vienna</u>, where Watson introduces him to <u>Dr. Freud</u>. Using a treatment consisting largely of <u>hypnosis</u>, Freud helps Holmes shake off his addiction and his delusions about Moriarty, but neither he nor Watson can revive Holmes' dejected spirit.

What finally does the job is a whiff of mystery: one of the doctor's patients is kidnapped and Holmes' curiosity is sufficiently aroused. The case takes the three men on a breakneck train ride across Austria in pursuit of a foe who is about to launch a war involving all of Europe. Holmes remarks during the denouement that they have succeeded only in postponing such a conflict, not preventing it; Holmes would later <u>become involved</u> in a "<u>European War</u>" in 1914.

The story was adapted for the screen in 1976 in a <u>Universal Studios</u> production, directed by <u>Herbert Ross</u>, The film was made at <u>Pinewood Studios</u> with location shooting in the UK and <u>Austria</u> (including the famous <u>Austrian National</u> <u>Library</u>); the tennis match/duel between Freud and von Leinsdorf was filmed on one of the historic <u>real tennis</u> courts at the <u>Queen's Club</u> in <u>West Kensington, London</u>.^[3] The chase on the trains was shot with set-dressed British steam locomotives and freight cars dressed up as coaches.
