Note: GPS directions may include gated roads. Enter Friendly Valley on Friendly Valley Parkway to avoid gates and to check-in with guard.





DIRECTIONS

From the southbound Antelope Valley Fwy 14 turn off at Via Princessa & turn right. Turn left on Sierra Hwy to Friendly Valley Parkway. Turn right and stop at security booth. (See "From Security Booth" below.)

From the northbound Antelope Valley Fwy 14 turn off at Golden Valley Rd & turn left. Turn right on Sierra Hwy past Rainbow Glen to Friendly Valley Parkway. Turn left and stop at security booth.

From Security Booth: Tell guard you are going to "McCleary" and proceed to Avenue of the Oaks. Make a left at Clubhouse complex and proceed to Green Terrace Drive (past golf course on your right). Right on Green Terrace to Circle Knoll Court, a one-way street. Make a right. 26412 will be on your left about half way around the circle. Park either side of the street just before or after George's address. Enter through gate to left of house.

A Mountain Railroad Frames Dennis & Sheri Buckley's Yard

An evening open house on a balmy September Saturday showed off Dennis and Sheri Buckley's rambling railroad and its charms. Dennis has been working on his railroad for years, adding a building here and a siding there. The roadbed is set in decomposed granite and the mainline wraps around the wide backyard.

Club members entered through a side gate and found a small rail stop with box cars waiting for pickup, as a mogul circled over a trestle bridge and made the return trip to the relatively busy complex around a bend at the far end of the yard.

Dennis has set up the track on a level raised bed (good for running live steam!!) in front of gently sloped "hills" along his fence. Strategically placed small boulders hold the slope in place while providing "mountains" for the mainline to travel past. A tunnel at each end of the layout maintains the "hilly" terrain while allowing the track to circle back in a continuous loop.

The town features an engine house, passenger and freight stations and a mine complex. Buildings are all appropriately lit and the layout sparkles at night. Grant brought his European passenger train and everyone enjoyed watching the train with its illuminated interiors travel the tracks.

Club members Jim Owens, Gene Rizzardi, Gary Woolard and your author, and Grant and Jenny Sweer enjoyed an evening talking trains, layout construction, and landscaping with our hosts, Dennis and Sheri. We especially enjoyed hearing that the railroad entertained guests at the Buckleys' daughter's wedding. Our thanks for this opportunity to enjoy a beautiful railroad.


